

Sophia Bildhaeuser (née Schmidl) is a social and cultural anthropologist working at the United Nations University Institute for Environment and Human Security (UNU-EHS) as a research associate for the EC-funded project “Environmental Change and Forced Migration Scenarios” (EACH-FOR). At the same time she is working at UNU-EHS for the MICROCON-project doing her PhD with the University of Vienna, focusing on “formal” and “informal” institutions in Lesotho in regards to water management.

Her diploma thesis presented an analysis of conflict resolution processes in some selected African ‘traditional’ societies in regards to their rational-communicative aspects (Jürgen Habermas) and of mediation in Austria.

Her focus of interest is on “traditional” processes, strategies and mechanisms of conflict resolution and on Anthropology of Law.

Prior to her appointment at the UNU-EHS, Sophia worked as a teaching assistant for Legal Anthropology and Ethnohistory at the Institute for Cultural and Social Anthropology (University of Vienna). She also acquired experience during her internship at the “Suedwind Agentur for South-North Education and Public Relation” (NPO) in Vienna and as a representative for a humanitarian and Christian-religious institution in British Columbia (Canada) by engaging in organizational and teaching activities there.
